

Forest Green Classroom (0 -12 months)

Welcome to the Forest Green Classroom. This classroom is the first and Second step to your Child's journey here at Nanny's Early Learning Center.

Classroom Arrangements: This classroom is set up with a half wall dividing it into two separate rooms. On one side there are 8 babies ranging from 0-6 months. On the other side there are 8 babies ranging from 6-12 months.

Ratio: The ratio in this classroom is 4 babies to 1 teacher; this means that each side will have 8 babies, 2 teachers.

Curriculum: The teachers will interact with the babies by reading books, singing songs, creating fun sensory activities, playing with toys to help them progress in each developmental category, and engaging in conversation throughout the day.

Goals: The goals on the younger side are to teach your child how to become more independent and alert to certain activities and things happening around them. Examples include; sitting up, crawling, holding their bottle, enjoying tummy time, and interacting more with others.

The goals on the older side are to grasp having a set schedule, become more comfortable with friends and teachers, enjoy trying new experiences, and learn how to understand simple one step directions given by teachers.

Schedule: On the younger side there are no set times for the babies when it comes to eating, sleeping, playing, diapering, etc. Your baby will have their own schedule based off of the specific instructions you give us.

On the older side, they will have a set schedule. They will eat breakfast, lunch and snack at a set time. They will have a visual schedule posted on the parent board so that you will know the set daily schedule.

Items Needed: The basic items your child will need consist of, diapers, a change of clothes, formula (if different than basic Enfamil), bottles, and any diapering ointments.

What We Provide: We provide wipes (fragrance free), formula (basic Enfamil), baby food, and bedding.

How to help your child: In the younger classroom, the best way to help your infant is to give them plenty of tummy time and try and get them on a set feeding schedule.

In the older classroom, the best way to help your child is to teach them basic feeding skills like sitting in a high chair and feeding themselves. You can also help them by exposing them to a variety of toys and teaching them basic play techniques.
